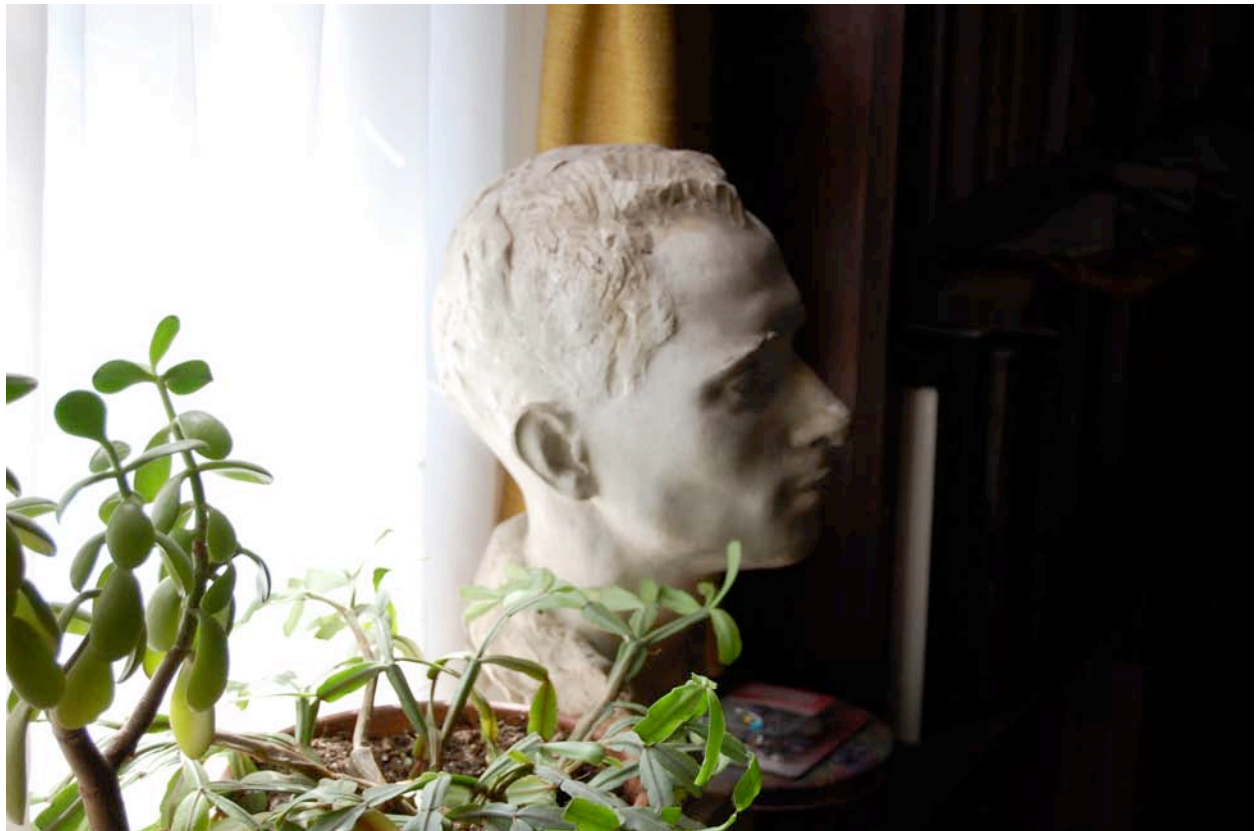

Let it bleed







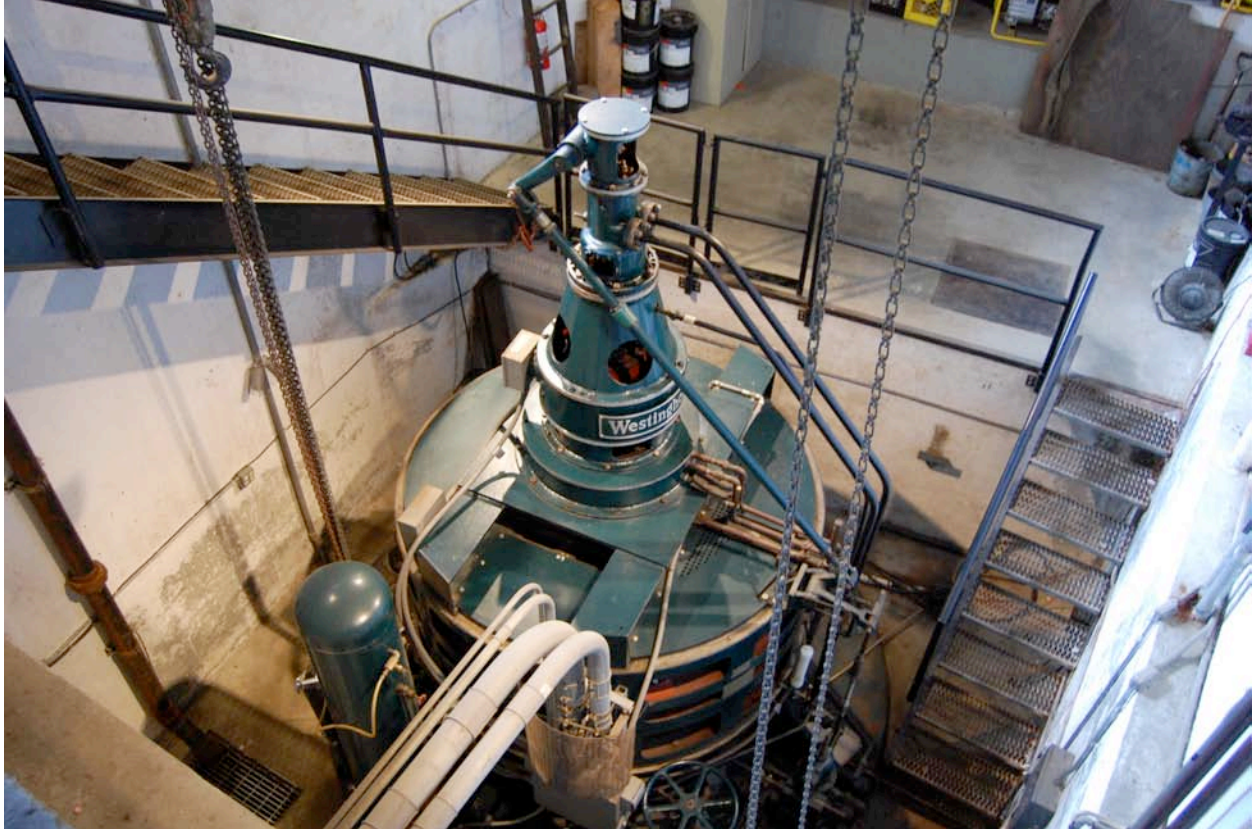
